

EMPLOYER NOTICE

Update on the Student Exemption Process

WHO SHOULD READ THIS NOTICE

Finance directors, human resources and payroll professionals

SITUATION OVERVIEW

In December 2023, we notified you that students would no longer receive text messages as part of the student exemption process due to U.S. regulations that require permission from individuals to send text messages to their mobile phones. We have made the necessary changes to comply with these regulations and will again send text messages for the student exemption process beginning November 6, 2024.

If you, as the employer, provide a phone number for the student on the student exemption form in ECS, we will send that student a text message informing them of the student exemption process. The text message will read, "Reply JOIN to this message to receive a link to the Student Exemption Form. Message frequency varies. Message and data rates may apply. Reply STOP to stop these messages and HELP for assistance. View our Privacy Policy and Terms & Conditions".

We are happy to once again be able to provide this convenient way for student employees to access the form and information pertaining to their student exemption choice.
